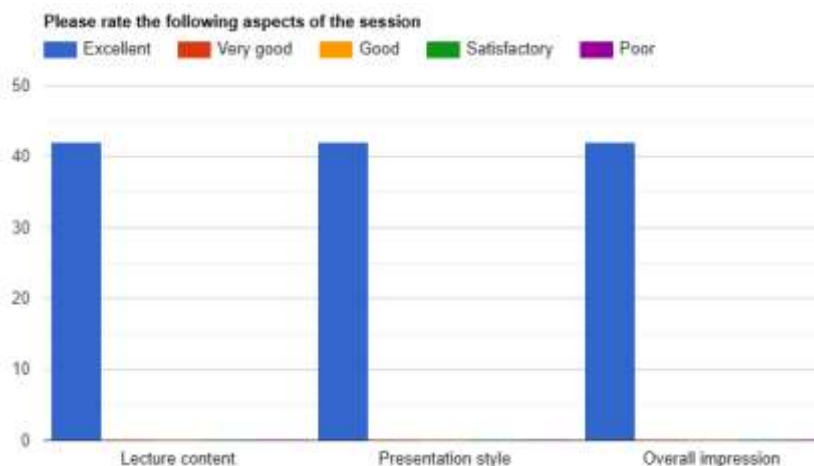

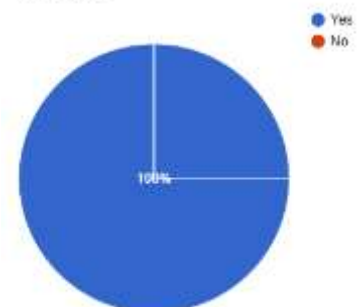

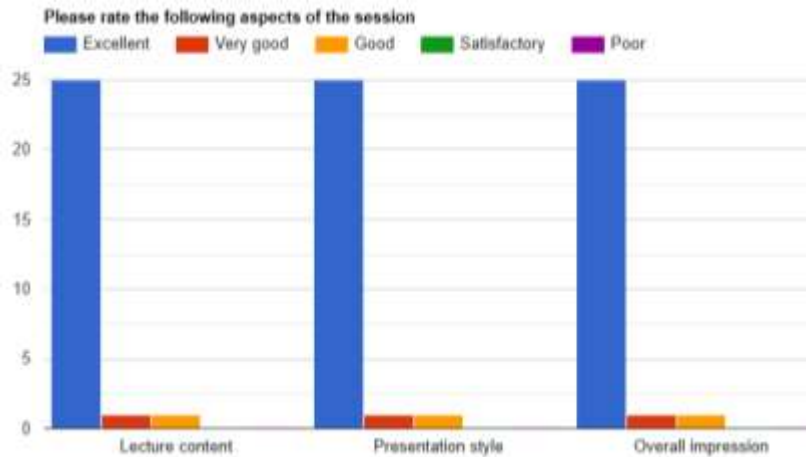

- Total feedback received from 78 participants, from three different broadcasts



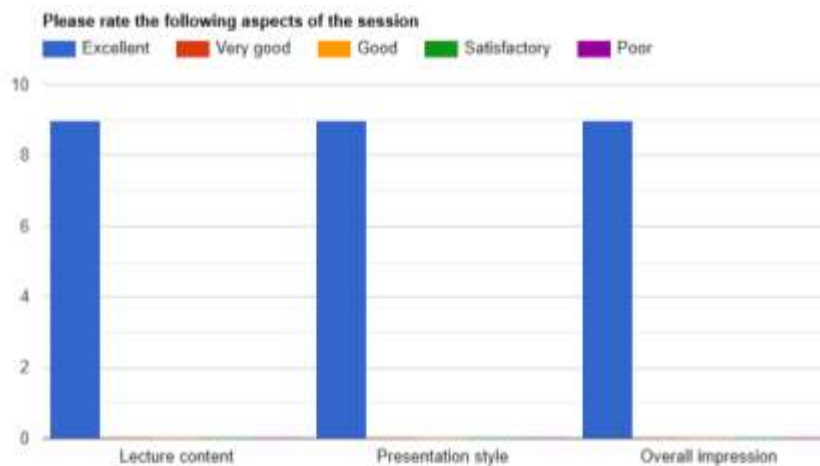
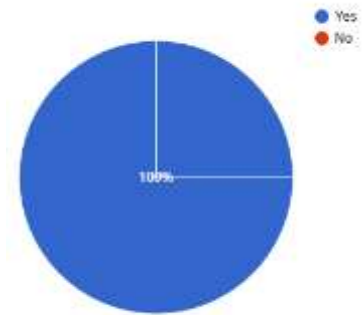
